Dear Parents,

Different types of languages are spoken by people from different regions, but the most important thing is that any language when spoken should be spoken correctly. Use of magic words like excuse me, sorry, thanks, please.

When asking for something, say "Please."

When receiving something, say "Thank you."

Do not interrupt grown-ups who are speaking with each other unless there is an emergency.

If you need to get somebody's attention right away, the phrase "excuse me" is the most polite way for you to enter the conversation.

When you have any doubt about doing something, ask permission first. It can save you from many hours of grief later.

When you have spent time at your friend's house, remember to thank his or her parents for having you over and for the good time you had.

Children can be encouraged to use simple words and sentences at home also. For example –

Mummy, can I help you in the kitchen?

Mummy, can I lay the table today?

Mummy, should I help you wash the dishes today?

Papa, can I help you wash the car?

Grandpa, should I come with you for a walk?

Grandma, should I help you put the thread in the needle?

Mummy, can I get you a glass of water?

Mummy, may I take some more Ice-Cream from the fridge?

Papa, I'm sorry I was rude to you.

Papa, please teach me how to ride a bicycle.

Mummy, can I join the summer workshop in the school?

Mummy, can I help you wash and soak the rice?

Mummy, should I cut the salad today?

Mummy, I will make a cup of tea for you. Please tell me where are the tea leaves.

Mummy, can you teach me to make cold coffee please?

Didi, can you help me find my English notebook? Papa, can we go cycling together today?

Wishing people properly – Hello Uncle / Auntie how are you?

Wishing parents and elders Good Morning, Good Afternoon, Good Evening and Good Night.

If we, as teachers and parents make a sincere effort and pay attention to the above mentioned points, we can help our children to learn, to understand and speak English at an early age.
